HOLIDAY PARTY

TRACK WORK

As of November Run Day, the inside track had been pulled from HQ to just beyond the east end of the Midway straight. A subsequent week or so saw the track removal extended almost to the Station. There were plans to have a number of people show up for a Mike Russo picnic on December 3 with the hopes of pulling the remaining sections. At that same time, the jig or first of multiple jigs for building the new track panels should be ready. Now, 300+ new panels will have to be constructed. As indicated in last month's *Steam Whistle*, the construction method is entirely different. No one is to build any panels without having received THE instructions for putting the panels together. THE instructions will be posted on the bulletin board in case you come by at another time, but you must receive training from an experienced builder; do not read the instruction sheet and jump in.

Obviously, this plan will require a lot of manpower to fulfill. Please try to come out whenever you can for the Wednesday and Saturday work sessions. Surely the schedule will involve many long hours at many sessions. If the track is not replaced by April's Run Day next Spring, operations will be run on the single track.

RECYCLING

There is a metal trash can in the HQ building with an orange cover marked for recycling aluminum. It is appreciated when you dispose of your soda cans in this can, but there are some requests regarding just how the can is handled. First, please make sure the can is empty – dump the remaining contents down the drain if necessary. Then, either squash the can using the tool posted above the trash can OR just toss the can without squeezing it in any manner (these cans are weak aluminum, not 1970's steel).

Squashing the can rather than squeezing it permits better packing within the plastic trash can liner, and the recycler can more easily find material which is not supposed to be in the load. Emptying the can prevents leaking soda from accumulating in the bottom of the liner. Regardless of the method by which the cans are 'prepared', there will be sharp edges which put holes in the bag. Those holes allow any remaining soda to leak all over your very pleasant editor's car when the load is taken to the recycler. He will not continue to display his current pleasantness if the leakage continues.

Other light aluminum cans and containers can be tossed into the recycling, too, but heavier aluminum and other non-ferrous metals should be left on the floor by the can. Dirty napkins, food wrappers, garbage, etc. are not recyclable; please put them in one of the trash containers. Your recycling volunteer does not mind rummaging through the recycling container to find cans which need to be squashed, but having to move his fingers through garbage is not appreciated.

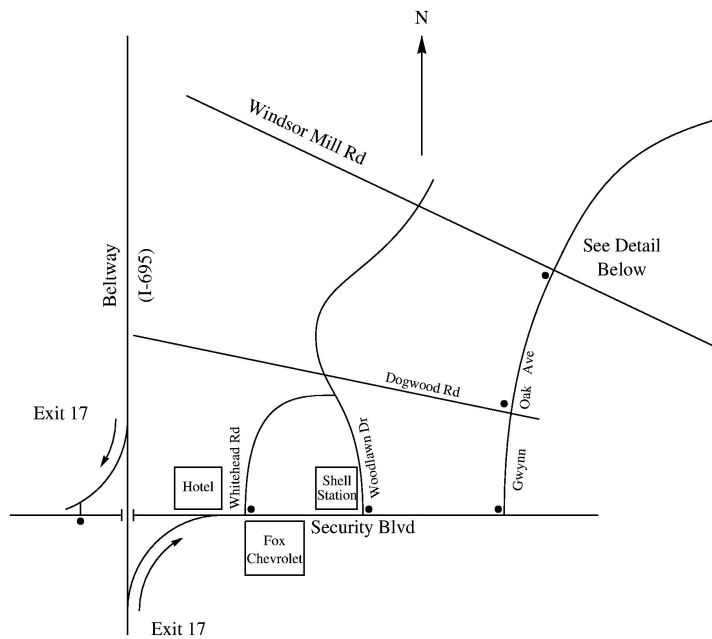

HOLIDAY PARTY DIRECTIONS

Directions to St. Luke's Parish Hall: take the Baltimore Beltway to Security Boulevard at Exit 17 (since Windsor Mill does not intersect with the Beltway). If you are coming from the north (outer loop of the Beltway), turn left onto Security Blvd at the traffic light at the end of the ramp. If you are coming from the south (inner loop of the Beltway), stay in the right lane of the exit ramp, which will take you onto Security Blvd. Then from either direction proceed to the 3rd light (Gwynn Oak Ave.) where you turn left. Continue to the 2nd traffic light and turn right onto Windsor Mill Road. There are several store fronts on the left ending at 2 driveways. Turn left into the wide driveway (mailbox on your left) and proceed to the back of the parking lot (shared with the Baptist church). The white building wall that you see ahead is the wall of the Parish Hall. Park and walk up the path on the left side of the Parish Hall (between it and St. Luke's Church) to the entrance.
