## MAY RUN DAY

The weather for May 2008 was similar to so much of the weather lately. It was cool and breezy with showers forecast for the afternoon. The rain did eventually come in a few dribs and drabs, much like the numbers of our customers – a few at a time all day. Mike Schroeder led a crew to the Hamilton’s to pick up the Adams. Harry Horney brought out his FA pair and Steve Zuiderveen and Ned Treat ran Wendy. John Frederick ran his Shay with a multi-car train. He did not carry passengers because his engine does not supply train brakes, but he did provide atmosphere. Norm Warfield, Jr also ran his switcher with a single car for his family. It was Mother’s Day and the Adams was out, so Sparky Hamilton’s family was out with her and they made the last ride of the day. All-in-all, there were too many seats for the customers present. Generally a disappointment except for the steamers.

## HERB FESTIVAL

Two weekends after Public Run Day we were back out for the Herb Festival. The weather was beautiful and the Festival crowd appeared to be more like days of yore. The car parking was on the athletic fields rather than on Windsor Mill Road. We were ready for the crowd. Harry Horney’s FAs were pulling the coaches; Wendy was in front of four gons; the Western Maryland had its complement of gondolas. At mid-afternoon the Blue Switcher replaced the Western Maryland. Again, we had many more seats than customers! There were two full loads back-to-back around 12:30 and the final run at 4 o’clock was full. Otherwise almost all trains departed half

to two-thirds empty – even when only two trains were running. The satisfying point was that the riders must not have spent money on herbs because they provided more donations than on the first two Run Days combined.

### **CALS AT CASS**

The annual excursion weekend at Cass was fairly successful this year. There were high hopes of running the first ever diesel passenger run from Elkins to Spruce. Unfortunately, CALS is the first excursion of the year and hiccups are always a potential problem. A few years ago, as an example, the track to the top of Bald Knob was not acceptable for a public trip and CALS stopped at the wye. This year, the tunnel east of Elkins was suffering from some collapse problems which were not repaired until after our weekend. The guys had to scurry to make alternate arrangements which would not upset our customers to a significant degree. Thus there was a special run by the Edwards car and a couple of additional caboose rides at Cass. Everyone returned without bullet holes, so the adjustments must have been at least somewhat acceptable. There might be a formal report in the future.

### **ELECTION NOMINATIONS**

There will be elections for the Board of Directors at this year's annual meeting being held on Sunday, July 6, at Hamilton Station. There will definitely be a need for some new blood because not all of the current directors will be running for the new two-year term.
