WHERE ARE WE?

That question is regarding the street address of CALS at Leakin Park. Be assured that there are no markings and no one knows where the Slocum Athletic Fields are located. The question applies for the location for fuel oil deliveries or DLLR or the police. From checking a number of mapping programs, it seems that the entrance from Windsor Mill Road is in the 5100 block of Windsor Mill Road. There is a cross street which can be used to get close: Crimea Road [Seems that should be a 'River'; "Cry me a road" doesn't sound very lyrical.], which is on the other side of Windsor Mill going back to the school. It's sufficient to get someone close enough to meet them and point them to the proper entrance drive. Note that the train station can be located on a GPS by using 1920 Eagle Drive, 21207. Exact addresses are dependant upon the GPS program used.

DOG-NOT-GONE IT

Your editor showed up at the Park on Valentine's Day morning hoping to get some kind of work done. As the only one there, not much was going to happen, but he couldn't get in the door anyway because a boxer-like dog was zealously guarding a child's shoe which was lying by the door. Unsure whether the nasty snarling, growling, and barking were due to rabies or fear, he called 311 for Animal Control and later 911 for the Police, in case the shoe was the result of something truly nefarious. This activity entailed many phone calls and a trip across Windsor Mill Road to determine the name of the street over there, and thus was engendered the paragraph above describing CALS' address.

INSPECTIONS

Boiler inspections will be provided at Leakin Park on Friday and Saturday, the 17th and 18th of April. The State Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation will write certificates as in past years. You need to have a boiler certificate to run at Leakin Park. The normal suggestion is for retired folks to come out on Friday and those who have to work or travel can have time on Saturday.

DLLR also has to inspect all the passenger cars we will run during the year. If you will be running your own car to carry passengers, you will have to bring it to the inspection session. A work day in March will be dedicated to our pre-inspection so that we can repair any problems, such as brake rigging or wobbly trucks. We have asked for the inspection to be held on Wednesday March 25 or April 1. Contact Craig Close for the actual date for the car inspection.

ACTIVITY NOTES

Mike Schroeder with help from Tim Allen worked several more hours prepping the lawn tractor fleet for the spring and summer chores. Mike pulled the decks off the tractors; then he sharpened the blades while Tim cleaned and painted the undersides. Mike also changed the oil and made sure the tractors would start. We're now ready to cut the grass. Lou Krapp is working at home building rail sections for the 1" track. He was ready for some curved sections, so some time was used to bend a number of pieces of rail for him. Raked up the leaves lying around since the fall. The wooden step ladder finally snapped in a couple of places. Jim Carpenter visited a "home store" to buy a 10" fiberglass replacement as well as a couple of grass rakes. There was an incident with a dog (see above) and Craig Close whiled away the time picking up most of the small branches which had fallen during the winter's several sessions of high wind. The old answering machine has been replaced – finally with a new, corrected announcement. Tim and Craig placed washers on screws for future track construction.

If you look closely at the photo below you will see that this track (it is actually on a rolling rack) uses special hold-downs rather than the simple washers used by CALS. Enlarged, the screws appear to be allen-head. Oh, yeah, that is a 1 ½” scale, propane-fired, live steam, C&O H-8 Allegheny. It will be running at the C&O Historical Society in Clifton Forge, VA. The loco is on long-term loan to COHS by The Kansas City Union Station Museum. It might be impressive!
